ABOUT THE NEED

Many providers offer housing and financial services West of Main Street, but some neighborhoods where the need for these services is high may be underserved. There are 46 providers west of Main Street in Buffalo providing either financial or housing services. These are concentrated near the city's downtown and along Main Street, but are less common in some parts of the city with a greater need for these services. Only 17% of providers provide food support West of Main st.

In 14207 there is one FeedMore Certified Food Pantry, Hearts for the Homeless. In 14207 there is one food service location that provides hot meals to go to the community, Asamblea de Iglesias Cristianas 213 Ontario St. These two organizations are lead by missions of faith and supported by faith communities throughout WNY and beyond. COVID-19 has challenged the communities within 14207 and additional support is required. the West Side Promise Neighborhood is seeking to help.



MISSION, VISION, AND GOALS

The West Side Promise Neighborhood Initiative is a diverse group of community members that are committed to improving the lives of children and their families living on Buffalo's West Side.

WSPN is dedicated to improving outcomes in four strategic zip codes that compose the neighborhood historically known as the "West Side". Those zip codes include 14201, 14213, 14207, and 14222. 14207 zip code is furthest North from City Hall and many resources. Our model simple, let our neighbors lead the way and help when asked. Supporting change means creating organic partnership at all levels in the short term with long term commitment.

FOOD FINDER FLYER: A EARLY SUCCESS



RIVERSIDE

At WSPN we believe in the power of collective action. We also know that our neighbors have difficulty accessing information online. After community conversations indicated a gap, leaders called for the creation of a single resource, to share food security information. We answered.

Non profit partners provided information, government partners supported its creation, and business partners agreed to share- a resource we called the "Food Finder Flyer". Made with information for the upcoming two weeks and distributed as a one time effort during our holiday box project, the community called for the production of a regular flyer. **We answered.**

Meeting our neighbors, where they are. Engaging them together and in partnership. Delivering needed information and resource. Improving the quality of information available, specifically to our vulnerable neighbors.

That is our work.
